Future Dairy Farm Systems Project – NARF (Dargaville)

This project compares the productivity, profitability and impact on people and the environment on three farms, being:

- 1. Current Farm Kikuyu & ryegrass based pastures with up to 190 kg N/ha/annum, 3.1 cows/ha
- 2. Alternative Pastures Farm Fescue & cocksfoot based pastures, up to 190 kg N/ha, 3.1 cows/ha
- 3. Low Emissions Farm Kikuyu & ryegrass based pastures, designed to reduce methane emissions by 25% and nitrous oxide by 50%, no nitrogen applied, 2.3 cows/ha

This project is funded by DairyNZ, MPI (Sustainable Food & Fibre Futures) and Hine Rangi Trust.

CURRENT MANAGEMENT

- Pasture growth is slowing as soils dry out
- Cow condition has is holding or dropping slightly, and lighter cows will be put on OAD milking to prevent further weight loss.
- PKE is being fed on the Current and Alternative Pastures Farms, to FEI limits. This will be decreased if we get good rain and better growth.
- With the lower stocking rate on the Low Emissions Farm it is unlikely we do not need supplement at present.
- The chicory crop is ready for grazing and pasture area will be reduced, (so rotation lengthened) on the Alt Pastures Farm while cows are on the crop
- Zinc continues at a low dose (1/2 rate) with caramillo through the dosatron.
