Future Dairy Farm Systems Project – NARF (Dargaville)

This project compares the productivity, profitability and impact on people and the environment on three farms, being:

- 1. Baseline (Current) Farm Kikuyu & ryegrass based pastures with up to 190 kg N/ha/annum, 3.1 cows/ha
- 2. Alternative Pastures Farm Fescue & cocksfoot based pastures, up to 190 kg N/ha, 3.1 cows/ha
- 3. Low Emissions Farm Kikuyu & ryegrass based pastures, designed to reduce methane emissions by 25% and nitrous oxide by 50%, no nitrogen applied, 2.3 cows/ha

This project is funded by DairyNZ, MPI (Sustainable Food & Fibre Futures) and Hine Rangi Trust.

CURRENT MANAGEMENT

- Good pasture growth rates and utilisation has lifted covers to the calving target of 2,400 kg DM/ha.
- Targeting a 70 day grazing rotation now and will use the spring rotation planner to gradually reduce this down to 30 days by mid-September. Alternative pastures farm may speed up quicker in September as these pastures go to seedhead a month earlier than ryegrass.
- Most cows have reached target calving condition. PKE feeding will stop on the Low Emissions Farm and reduce to 2 kg DM/cow on the other two farms. The new covered feed pad is now being used.
- Magnesium supplementation will start to all cows with lime flour added for the colostrum cows. Calf sheds are almost ready for calving.
- Sustain at 60 kg/ha will continue behind the cows on the Baseline and Alternative Pastures Farms.
