



Supplement Use in a Variable Climate Project – NARF (Dargaville)

This project compares three farms with different supplement use on production, profit and environmental impact. The three farm systems are:

- 1. Pasture Only Farm No imported supplement 2.7 cows/ha
- 2. PKE Only Farm PKE used to fill feed gaps within milk FEI limits 3.1 cows/ha

3. PKE Plus Farm - PKE used until milk FEI limit and then other supplements added - 3.1 cows/ha

CURRENT MANAGEMENT

- Average of farm pasture covers have dropped. Though pre-graze pasture covers are good now the feed wedge shows we are likely to have a shortage of grass in two weeks time. Rotation length has been a bit faster than planned due a faster than expected calving on the Pasture Only and PKE Plus farms.
- To help resolve the expected drop in pre-graze pasture covers from mid August on, all paddocks to be grazed in 3 6 weeks time will receive an additional dose of nitrogen. Paddocks to be grazed in 3 4 weeks time will also be sprayed with ProGibb asap.
- Dry cows continue to get 40 m²/cow/day and milkers 80 m²/cow/day. Relatively good pasture utilisation and high pre-graze pasture covers has meant very little supplement has been required. This will change as our pre-graze covers drop over the next fortnight.
- The Pasture Only cows are in lighter condition than the other farms. Light conditioned cows are being put on once-a-day milking. We are holding off feeding our limited supply of baleage on this farm until we really need it.
- Urea will continue behind the cows at 80 kg urea/ha.
