



## Supplement Use in a Variable Climate Project – NARF (Dargaville)

This project compares three farms with different supplement use on production, profit and environmental impact. The three farm systems are:

1. Pasture Only Farm - No imported supplement - 2.7 cows/ha

2. PKE Only Farm – PKE used to fill feed gaps within milk FEI limits – 3.1 cows/ha

3. **PKE Plus Farm** - PKE used until milk FEI limit and then other supplements added – 3.1 cows/ha *This project is funded by DairyNZ, MPI (Sustainable Farming Fund) and Hine Rangi Trust.*

## **CURRENT MANAGEMENT**

- Kikuyu has kicked into life despite the dry weather and has held up pasture cover and growth over the last fortnight. Ryegrass is wilting in the hot weather.
- The Pasture Only farm has not required silage at this stage while the two PKE farms (with a higher stocking rate) have been getting 3.1 kg DM PKE/cow/day and either silage or DDG. All three farms have silage on hand which will be fed as required to keep cows in milk.
- Milk FEI has dropped to a comfortable level around the A/B border on the two PKE farms. This drop in FEI likely a result of higher pasture supply and other supplement feeding.
- Production/cow/day has dropped on the Pasture Only farm from 1.4 to 1.2 kg MS/cow/day over the last fortnight. Production has been steady on the other farms with a small advantage to the PKE Plus farm, likely due to DDG. A few light conditioned heifers are on once a day.
